Robert Zuk of Surrey, British Columbia, was the winner of the Northwest Invitational, a six-player event at the Haviland Hotel in Portland, Oregon. His score of 5-1 included wins over Mike Morris, Mike Montchalin, Mike Franett and Viktors Pupols. Needing only a draw in the final round to clinch first place. he still tried for the win against Oregon Champion Clark Harmon, but a draw was the result. He also drew with George Krauss in the first round. Viktos Pupols and Peter Biviasis tied for 2nd-3rd places with 4½-1½. Krauss was fourth with 31/2-21/2 and Mike Franett fifth with 3-3. Harmon was the only player not to win a single game. In fact. the entire Oregon contingent could score only 2½ out of a possible 16 points.
