Heading the list is Edward L. Arnold, newly elected president. He is at present serving as president of the Washington State Chess Federation, and has just finished a term as tournament director for the Seattle club, a position he held many times before.

For the fourth consecutive time Ray LeFever has been re-elected to the post of secretary-treasurer, in which he has served faithfully in the. In addition, Ray has held the post of Director for the United States Chess Federation.

The two directors will be Frank Wanders, and Clarence Bushnell. In addition, Bushnell has been elected by the new officers to the important position of Tournament Director for the coming year. Always a hard worker, he should be well satisfied.

Several times in the earlier tournament Joachim almost had the title within his grasp, but the chances eluded him. Sheets deserves full credit for his fine, uphill victory in the final showdown.

In tournaments to come these games will undoubtedly be the ones eagerly awaited by the chess fans.
