This practice is only intended to be temporary, and must be so, or the federation, as well as the paper, will be bankrupt.

The Everett and Skagit clubs are supporting the venture with close to 100% of their members as subscribers; the average among the rest of the clubs is about ten percent, the postal players in the largest group circulation.

One copy has been sent to each club -- free! In SOME of them it is the ONLY COPY in CIRCULATION!

Is it right for them to continue reading it free, and let the federation foot the bill?

RAISE THE STAKE

BE A BOOSTER FOR CHESS

Let's all give chess a boost whenever we have the opportunity.

The average layman is ignorant of the fascination of chess. But it is these people we must cultivate if chess is to get the popularity it deserves.

Be willing to take time out from a game, explain some of the elements to the kibitzers who likely as not know nothing whatsoever about chess. But they are prospects, otherwise they wouldn't be looking on.

I don't believe chess would remain unpopular with the non-playing public for long if that public knew the bare fundamentals of chess.

A good selling point on chess is that it is virtually impossible to play crooked chess. The pieces can't be stacked and the pawns can't be loaded. Everything is above board in chess. Wins come strictly on merit. How many other games have the same standard of honesty?

Many layman shy from chess because we have a tendency to ponder over the moves. Let's sacrifice some accuracy for speed in order to sell chess to a rather skeptical public.
