Format

An Open Swiss chess tournament in five sections:

- **Championship:** A 4-round, G/90; +30 dual USCF + FIDE rated Swiss open to players rated 2000+ USCF. Rounds: Saturday @ 10am, 5pm. Sunday @ 9am, 4pm. Entry Fee: \$80. \$70 play-up fee if rated 1800-1999 USCF. Free entry for GMs, IMs, WGMs, and WIMs.
- **Premier U2000:** A 5-round, G/60; d10 USCF rated Swiss open to players rated 1300-1999 USCF. Rounds: Saturday @ 9am, 12pm, 6pm. Sunday @ 9am, 12pm. Entry Fee: \$70. \$35 play-up fee if rated 1300-1499 USCF.
- **Rising U1500:** A 5-round, G/60; d10 USCF rated Swiss open to players rated below 1500 USCF. Rounds: Saturday @ 9am, 12pm, 6pm. Sunday @ 9am, 12pm. Entry Fee: \$60.
- Casual (18+): A 5-round, G/30; d10 unrated Swiss open to players from unrated to 1000 USCF. Rounds: Saturday @ 9am, 10:45am, 12:30pm, 2pm, 6pm. Entry Fee: \$30.
- **Scholastic (K-12):** A 5-round, G25; d5 NWSRS rated Swiss in four sections: K-3 U700, K-3 Open, 4-12 U900, 4-12 Open. Rounds: Saturday @ 9am, 10:15am, 11:30am, 1pm, 2:15pm. Entry Fee: \$30. Chess clocks used from the start in the Open sections. Clocks not required for the U700 and U900 sections, until a tournament director places one into unfinished games set for G/10; d5 after 35 minutes of play.

Rating

Championship, Premier, and Rising are USCF rated; Championship also FIDE rated. April 2025 US Chess regular rating will be used to determine section and pairings. Casual section is unrated, with no US Chess membership required. Scholastic side event is NWSRS rated, with no US Chess membership required.

Prizes

\$8,500 based on 250 paid entries.

Championship: 1st – 3rd Place: \$850-700-550. 1st U2300/U2100: \$400

Premier U2000: 1st - 3rd Place: \$600-550-400. 1st U1800/U1600: \$250

Rising U1500: 1st – 10th Place: \$240-225-210-195-180-165-150-135-120-105. 1st U1300/U1100: \$100.

Casual (18+): 1st - 10th Place: \$150-140-130-120-110-100-90-80-70-60.

Special Prizes (per section): Biggest Upset Win: 1st \$30, 2nd \$20. Best Female Player (by TPR): \$50, Best Senior Player (Age 50+, by TPR): \$50.

Scholastic (K-12): $1^{st} - 5^{th}$ Place trophies awarded in each section. Medals for 1^{st} -time tournament players and biggest upsets in each section.

Game Analysis + All Comers Blitz with Special Guest GM Kayden Troff



Kayden Troff is a chess grandmaster who was born and raised in Utah. He learned chess when he was three years old from watching his dad and two older brothers play. Growing up, they played together, which led to many tournament victories and a competitive spirit among the brothers. This included many teaching opportunities, like running a summer chess camp with another chess family for seven years. Eventually, Kayden's brothers moved on to other things while Kayden continued to pursue chess.

Chess tournament achievements:

- 1st place 2009 U12 North American Youth Championship in Mazatlán, Mexico.
- 2nd place 2010 World Youth Championships, Under-12 section.
- 1st place 2012 World Youth Championships, Under-14 section.
- 1st place 2014 Under-21 U.S. Chess Champion
- Achieved the title of Grandmaster at age 16, becoming Utah's first home-grown GM!

Kayden has been coaching privately and in groups for 10+ years and spends much of his time streaming chess with Antonio Padron on Twitch under ChessSharkz.

No registrations accepted or refunds offered after the deadline.

One half-point bye available in Championship section and two half-point byes available in all other sections. If interested, request before the end of round 2.
