

Seattle Kings vs Princes Match IV & Queens vs Princesses

Format:

Four Scheveningen-style team matches, in which a team of 5 adults (Kings/Queens) will play against a team of 5 juniors (Princes/Princesses). Each player will face one of the opposing team members once over the course of 5 rounds. All games will be dual USCF and FIDE rated. The aim of this event is to increase the number of Northwest players with established FIDE ratings and to support local junior players seeking experience in preparation for World Youth Competitions.

Sections:

Kings vs Princes IV: Expert or higher (2000+)
Queens vs Princesses: Class B or higher (1600+)
Kings vs Princes A: Class A (1800-2000)
Kings vs Princes B: Class B (1600-1800)

March 2017 US Chess rating supplement will be used to determine section.

Entry Fee: \$75

Time Control: 90 minutes for the first 40 moves followed by 30 minutes for the rest of the game with an addition of 30 seconds per move starting from move one.

Schedule: The drawing of lots will take place on Sunday March 12th at 10pm at the Rose Hill Starbucks in Kirkland. Address: 12209 NE 85th St Kirkland, WA 98033. Attendance is optional, though encouraged.

Prizes: Each player will be awarded \$25 per point earned, including draws.*
*Players who withdraw from the tournament will be ineligible to win prize money.
